ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION OF LICENSE

On the 8th day of June, 2016, the West Virginia Board of Osteopathic Medicine (hereinafter referenced as the "Board") met to review allegations that the Respondent, Sanjay Mehta, D.O., had engaged in unprofessional and unethical conduct. Whereupon, the Board determined that there was probable cause to believe the allegations against the Respondent and to issue a Statement of Charges based upon those allegations.

The Board then considered the nature of these charges, as well as other charges previously reviewed by the Board and additional information regarding Respondent. Pursuant to W. Va. Code 30-1-8(e)(1), the Board is authorized to suspend a license prior to a hearing if the licensee's continuation in practice constitutes an immediate danger to the public.

Based upon the facts as outlined in the Statement of Charges, the Board hereby finds that the Respondent in this matter is an immediate danger to the public as demonstrated by his actions in the death of five patients. The Board hereby **ORDERS** that the license of Sanjay Mehta, D.O., #1754, is immediately **SUSPENDED** upon entry of this Order.
