ORDER TERMINATING CONSENT ORDER

On November 1, 2024, the West Virginia Board of Osteopathic Medicine ("Board") considered whether the March 20, 2023, Consent Order between the Board and Brandon Cestaric, D.O. ("Dr. Cestaric"), in the above-captioned matter should be terminated.

The Consent Order, *inter alia*, set forth certain treatment conditions that Dr. Cestaric would be required to abide by for at least three (3) years. On September 11, 2024, Dr. Cestaric sent an email to the Board requesting to be released from the treatment conditions at this time because his license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery expired on June 30, 2024. Dr. Cestaric indicated that he currently has no plans of practicing medicine. Dr. Cestaric also acknowledged that, if he ever applies for reinstatement of his license in the future, the treatment could be resumed.

After review of the information before it, and since Dr. Cestaric does not possess an active license in West Virginia, the Board determined that the March 20, 2023, Consent Order should be terminated. As such, the Board **ORDERS** that the March 20, 2023, Consent Order regarding Complaint No. 2022-08 is **TERMINATED**. The Board further **ORDERS** that, if Dr. Cestaric applies for reinstatement of his license in the future, treatment terms and conditions may be applied to his license if reinstated.
