## New Legislative Rules Passed **During 2010 Legislative Session**

H.B. 4108:

Authorized the WV Board of Osteopathy to promulgate the following

legislative rules:

24 CSR 1 §4.2.4

Acceptance of post-graduate, clinical training in a program approved by the AOA, which may also include a program approved under the

AOA's Resolution 42 procedure;

OR

Post graduate clinical training in a program approved by the ACGME AND 40 hours of continuing medical education in osteopathic medicine with osteopathic manipulative treatment in courses approved and

classified as Category IA, by the AOA.

§30-14A-1(p)

Revisions to correlate osteopathic physician assistant's prescriptive writing privileges with allopathic physician assistant's prescriptive writing privileges; i.e., deleting antipsychotics as an exclusion and changing the time limitations for refills from forty-eight (48) to seventy-two (72) hours for Schedule III drugs.

#### NEW RULES FOR PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

#### SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

The Board has chosen to draw a bright line regarding physician-patient boundaries and to change its rule to parallel the AOA Code of Ethics. It is now grounds for disciplinary action if a physician engages in sexual contact with a current patient who is not their spouse.

#### PRESCRIBING CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

The Board has additional requirements relating to Controlled Substances. It is grounds for disciplinary action to prescribe controlled substances without making an in-person examination of the patient at least one out of every six months of treatment. Physicians must make and keep thorough documentation of patient exams, along with notes on the diagnosis, basis for and plan of treatment.

#### TREATING FAMILY MEMBERS

In addition, the Board now allows a physician to prescribe a Controlled Substance to a member of the physician's immediate family for a period of up to three (3) days, after which the family member should obtain care from another physician. "Immediate Family" is defined as a person within one degree of kinship, or a relative living in the physician's household.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON 2010 RENEWALS

#### LICENSE RENEWALS

Those osteopathic physicians whose license expires on June 30, 2010, will receive their renewal applications the first week of May. PLEASE COMPLETE IMMEDIATELY to insure no lapse in licensure. The renewal fees have increased to \$400. Any renewal application postmarked after June 30, 2010, will be charged an additional \$100 fee. REMEMBER, it is the responsibility of each licensee to notify the Board of any address changes. Renewal applications will be mailed to the last known address provided by the licensee. If mail is returned, it could jeopardize your license.

### PLLC ANNUAL RENEWALS

If you, as a physician, are practicing as a PLLC, Professional Limited Liability Corporation, you are required to send the Board Office, on or before July 1, 2010 the following:

- 1) PLLC Renewal Application
- 2) Documentation of at least \$1,000,000 of professional liability insurance
- 3) A copy of your annual report that was filed with the Secretary of State's Office
- 4) \$200 Renewal Fee

## OSTEOPATHIC CORPORATION RENEWALS

The renewals for Corporations are due every two years as per WV Code §30-14-9b. Renewal applications are due prior to July 1, 2010 with a renewal fee of \$400.
